
Spiritual Journeys



engrossing desert safaris. Exquisitely painted Havelis and rich Jain temple heritage, along with museums and lakes, can enrich your holiday experience. Riding a camel to explore the enthralling beauty of setting sun at Sam Sand Dunes is once-in-a-lifetime experience.



4 Jodhpur Popular as the Sun City and the Blue City, Jodhpur attracts tourists to its iconic Mehrangarh Fort and a host of other attractions like Jaswant Thada royal cenotaphs, Umaid Bhawan Palace, Balsamand Lake and many more. Flying Fix adventure at the fort and many amazing festivals are other highlights of the city which is also popular for its cuisines like kachoris, dal bati churma, mirchibada and ghevar.


