What entertained the Royal Indian Gamers as hunting grounds for centuries are today amongst the world's most well-preserved wildlife reserves. From the forest slopes of the North and Northeast, the dense woods of Central India and the lavish green tropical jungles of the South, there are habitats of all kinds and what make them even more remarkable are the safari tours designed to explore them. Jeep safaris can be thrilling to watch the game from close by, however, the elephant safaris make the experience even wider and heartbeat-raising.

The Indian National parks and wildlife sanctuaries are the finest examples of the natural habitats in the world, where the most striking and some of the rarest animals can be seen. ❶ Sariska Tiger Reserve

Hang out with the royal tigers of Bengal which successfully relocated and adapted to one of the world's best tiger reserves. Sariska National Park in Rajasthan preserves its riches capably, be it the population of leopard, sambhar, jackals, antelopes and other wild lives or the royal heritage of Kankwadi Fort, Sariska Palace and an array of magnificent Hindu Temples.

❷ Keoladeo Bird National Park

Cheer up your flying spirits at Keoladeo Bird National Park, formerly Bharatpur Bird Sanctuary, which is a heaven for the bird-watchers and ornithologists. The wetland, which is also a World Heritage Site, greets over 370 bird species (including waterfowls and landbirds), many of which leave their homes to prettify this amazing avifauna sanctuary of Rajasthan. Endangered Siberian Crane, grey hornbill, greater spotted eagle and painted stork are among the highlights that would demand your attention.

❸ Ranthambore Tiger Reserve

True to the grandeur of the royal Rajasthan, Ranthambore is home to the undisputed dominating beast of jungle, the stately Bengal tigers. Look directly into the eyes of the creature as it crosses your way and you will surely be left with a racing heart. Explore other outstanding attractions like huge banyan trees, wild animals like leopard, sloth bear, wild boar and hyena and the splendid Ranthambore Fortress.

❹ Kanha National Park

If the invigorating tale of Mowgli and Sher Khan entertained your childhood, Kanha National Park takes you to the backdrop that inspired Rudyard Kipling to write the inimitable Jungle Book. Largest in the Central India, the national park of Madhya Pradesh is home to tigers, leopards, wild dogs, swamp deer, hulgans and a variety of reptiles. Switch from dense forests to the open grasslands and discover surprises like ghost trees, migratory birds and aquatic plants.

❺ Pench Tiger Reserve

The magic of Kipling's Jungle Book and the Second Jungle Book extends to the Pench Tiger Reserve, another wildlife reserve in the close proximity of Kanha. Treasures of wildlife await the visitors at Pench, inhabited by the carnivores and herbivores in an impressive ratio. Tigers, leopards, jungle cats, sloth bear, civets, wolves, nilgai, sambhar, chital, gaur and many other creatures, along with plethora of birds, exaggerate the pleasure of being here.

❻ Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve

Get ready for another wild expedition in Madhya Pradesh that takes to Bandhavgarh, the place believed to have significant association with Ramayana. Another participant of Project Tiger, the park has been home to many internationally famed tigers like Bamera, Charger and Sita. Avifauna has its own charm at Bandhavgarh which hosts the presence of hornbills, barbets, herons, kingfishers, drongo and many other winged creatures. Bandhavgarh Fort and a number of historical caves enhance the splendor of the place.

❼ Kaziranga National Park

An acclaimed part of the Eastern Himalaya biodiversity hotspot in Assam, Kaziranga is a World Heritage Site and also a glittering name on the world wildlife tourism map. Crisscrossing rivers, marshlands and tall grasses make the settings perfect for the preservation of critically endangered one-horned rhinoceros, water buffalos and Eastern swamp deer. The park is also a famed habitat of a variety of big cats, including tigers and leopards. Worth mentioning is the significant attendance of birds and remarkable existence of diverse flora.

Take the delight of exploring wildlife to a new level by adding some extremely fabulous sightseeing places like Khajuraho, a collection of temples that showcase astonishing architecture and erotic sculptures. Discover the fortune of heritage with Taj Mahal and Agra Fort at Agra; Amber Fort and City Palace at Jaipur and Qutub Minar, Red Fort and Humayun's Tomb at Delhi. The tour goes beyond expectations with the magnificent monuments and Bundela paintings at Orchha, glorious Konark Temple at Bhubaneswar and Victoria Memorial at Kolkata.




Rajasthan's Royal Safari

- Day 1** – Arrival at Delhi
Arrival at Delhi. Sightseeing tour of Delhi.
- Day 2** – Delhi-Agra (200 Km / Appx. 4 to 5 hrs.)
Delhi to Agra transfer. Visit to Taj Mahal and Agra Fort.
- Day 3** – Agra-Fatehpur Sikri-Bharatpur (60 Km / Appx. 1 hr.)
Visit Fatehpur Sikri. Later arrive at Bharatpur and visit Kevaldeo Ghana National Park.



Morning and evening jungle safari at Ranthambore.
- Day 7** – Ranthambore / Ranthambore-Jaipur (160 Km / Appx. 4 hrs.)
Morning jungle safari at Ranthambore. Later proceed to Jaipur.
- Day 8** – Sightseeing of Jaipur
City tour of Jaipur covering City Palace, Hawa Mahal, Amber Fort, Jantar Mantar etc.
- Day 9** – Jaipur-Pushkar (146 Km / Appx. 4 hrs.)
Drive to Pushkar. En route visit Ajmer Sharif Shrine at Ajmer. Visit Pushkar Lake, Brahma Temple and Pushkar Fair Ground.


